Fremont Street Experience - Downtown Las Vegas



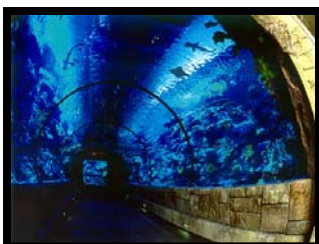
Located in Downtown Las Vegas, the Fremont Street Experience offers free nightly shows featuring 12.5 million lights and 550,000 watts of amazing sound. Enjoy free concerts and special events throughout the year. Times are 7pm, 8pm, 9pm, 10pm, 11pm, 12am. You can also take a walk through the Neon Museum, which hosts some of the old hotel's neon signs, located at the east end of the Fremont Street Experience.

Adventuredome at Circus Circus Hotel



The perfect Las Vegas attraction for the kids! This is an air-conditioned indoor theme park with 25 thrilling rides and attractions. It's free to walk around, but you will have to pay to get wet on Rim Runner or get sick on Chaos.

Shark Reef at Mandalay Bay Hotel



The Shark Reef transports visitors to an undersea ocean of sights, sounds and encounters. The Shark Reef contains more than 2,000 animals representing 100 different species in 1.6 million gallons of water. Open Sun - Thu 10am - 8pm; Fri - Sat 10am - 10pm. Admission: Adults \$16.95, Children 12 years old and younger \$10.95, Children 4 and younger admitted free.

ESPN Zone at New York New York Hotel and Casino



It's a high-tech sports fan's wildest dream come true. 'Zone Throne' viewing stations (reclining chairs with headsets) are installed in front of giant screens, or at booths where you can surf sports online then flip the channel to any televised game. Memorabilia hangs on the walls, and upstairs is a superstar arcade for the kids to play.

Manhattan Express Rollercoaster at New York New York Hotel and Casino



Let the good times roll! The Roller Coaster will lift you up 203 feet, drop you down 144 feet and leave your pulse trying to catch up to 67 mph. Simulating a jet fighter's barrel roll, you'll turn 180 degrees, hang 86 feet in the air, take the famous "heartline" twist and dive, Ah, what a rush.

The Stratosphere Tower



If you're an adrenalin seeker make sure you visit the Stratosphere Tower and Hotel where you will be shot, slung and hurled 900 feet in the air. The 3 extreme thrill rides are the Big Shot, the X Scream, and Insanity. The panoramic view from the top and the temporary sensation of free fall add to the ride's exhilaration. These rides are not for their faint hearted.

Treasure Island 'Sirens of TI' Battleship Show



Sexy sirens battle a band of renegade male pirates in Siren's Cove. Experience music, energy, dance, temptation, danger, excitement, sensuality & seduction.

Performances at 5:30pm, 7pm, 8:30pm, 10pm daily, weather permitting.

Liberace Museum



See the spectacular jewelry, pianos, rare cars, costumes at the Liberace Museum. Open Tue - Sat from 10am - 5pm, Sun from 12pm - 4pm, Public guided tours 11am & 2pm. Closed on Mondays. Admission \$6.50.

Gondola Ride at the Venetian



Experience a little bit of Italy right in Las Vegas. Ride through the Grand Canal in an authentic Venetian gondola as you go under the bridges, pass by the cafes and more. Your gondolier even serenades you with a song!

Q&A's

Can I get a babysitter?

Some hotels offer babysitting services. Normally they will give you a list of local babysitters which you can call to arrange alternatively the concierge can organise this for you. Just ask.

Where can I stay with a family of 5 or more?

Due to fire safety regulations the maximum occupancy in Las Vegas hotel rooms is 4 people. If you have a family of 5 or more we suggest looking at hotels such as the Hilton Grand Vacations Club and Hilton Grand Vacations. At these properties it is more like an apartment/hotel which can accommodate large family groups. Alternatively you can ask for an interconnecting door between 2 rooms at the hotel.
