Booking a room under 21

Q: If we're not 21, can we still rent a hotel room on the Strip?

A: Age policies vary greatly by hotel. We put together a general list of Las Vegas hotels and their age restrictions to book a room.

The vast majority of hotels on the Strip do require you to be 21 to reserve a hotel room. There are a few notable exceptions but the best thing to do would be to contact the hotel directly or to email us on lasvegas@marketingspirit.com.au
