ACCOMMODATIONS

HAVE WE GOT A ROOM FOR YOU.

Las Vegas has more accessible guest rooms than any city in the nation – perhaps even the world. Many hotels

offer rooms with roll-in showers, transfer showers, and tubs with built-in or portable seats. Ask your reservations agent

to book a room with your specific needs in mind. For additional details, please ask for the hotel's ADA coordinator.

ENTERTAINMENT & DINING

THE SHOW WON'T GO ON WITHOUT YOU.

Most Las Vegas showrooms have assistive listening devices for visitors with disabilities. Call ahead for more information. In addition, most restaurants, showrooms and lounges can conveniently accommodate wheelchairs.

CASINO GAMING

WE'VE LEFT NOTHING TO CHANCE.

Every Las Vegas hotel has accessible slot machines, and many have wheelchair access to table games too. What's more, casino staffs are well-trained to help visitors with disabilities play casino games. Many casinos offer sign language interpreters for available gaming lessons. Call in advance for details. Most bingo parlors have Braille and large-print game cards, and some of the larger establishments have electronic bingo, where players with vision or dexterity problems can play up to 100 cards at once.

SHOPPING

BUY, BROWSE OR BOTH.

All Las Vegas malls are accessible, with many offering free wheelchair rentals and other services. For additional information regarding specific needs, contact the shopping venue of your choice for additional details.

POOLS & SPAS

GET IN THE SWIM.

Don't forget to bring your swimsuit, because most Las Vegas hotels have lifts to assist you into our beautiful pools! You may also find a wheelchair-accessible "beach" entrance at some Las Vegas hotels. Go ahead, make a splash!

TRANSPORTATION

GETTING AROUND LAS VEGAS.

At McCarran International Airport, lift-equipped shuttles are available with service to any hotel for less than \$7.00.

The following companies offer accessible transportation:

Bell Transportation – Located outside Baggage Claim Door #1. Call 1-800-274-7433 or 702-739-7990.
CLS – Located outside Baggage Claim Door #4. Call 702-740-4545.



Grayline – Located outside Baggage Claim Door #3. Call 702-739-5700.

In all cases, airport shuttles run every 15-20 minutes. No advance reservations are needed from the airport. Some shuttles accommodate one wheelchair/scooter, some two. Call again to schedule your return to the airport.

CALL A CAB.

All Las Vegas taxi companies have lift-equipped vans that can accommodate one wheelchair or scooter. You can call a cab from your room, a dedicated taxi phone, or just ask the doorman at your hotel for an accessible taxi van.

HAIL A TROLLEY.

The Las Vegas Strip Trolley pulls up to the entrance of many hotels on its route about every 20 minutes, and most are lift-equipped. For details, call 702-382-1404.

GET ON THE BUS.

The fully accessible Las Vegas CAT (Citizens Area Transit) includes buses that are lift-equipped, kneel to the curb, and have low floors. Each bus accommodates two wheelchairs, and offers reduced fares for seniors and visitors with disabilities. The Strip route bus runs 24 hours a day. Call 702-CAT-RIDE (702-228-4800) for routes, schedules, or help in riding the bus.

If you're out and about on the Strip or Downtown, consider these handy options: The Las Vegas Monorail runs on the east side of the Strip between the Sahara Hotel and the MGM Grand and serves the Las Vegas Convention Center. Hotel-operated monorails also run between the Mirage and Treasure Island and between the Excalibur and Mandalay Bay. ALL monorails are accessible.

ACCESS AT THE AIRPORT.

If you need assistance while traveling through McCarran International Airport, contact the Information/Traveler's Aid desk near Ticketing. For the hearing-impaired, TTYs are available at the following airport locations:

- Rotunda
- Baggage Claim
- Ticketing Area
- "A" Gates – Four TTYs
- "B" Gates – Three TTYs
- "C" Gates – 11 TTYs
- "D" Gates – 13 TTYs

The Paging Office has one TTY to receive your calls.

PARKING IS NOT A PROBLEM.

Bring along your hometown dashboard parking permit for your personal vehicle or if you plan to rent a vehicle in Las Vegas. Out-of-state permits are recognized. Temporary disabled parking permits are available through the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles. Contact them in advance for an application at DMV Special Plates 775-684-4750 in Carson City or visit www.dmvnv.com. A physician's statement will be required. Alternatively, valet parking is available at most hotels.

PARATRANSIT WHEN YOU NEED IT.

In Southern Nevada, it's called CAT Paratransit, and if you're certified to ride the paratransit system in your hometown, bring your certification with you to ride ours up to 21 days without Nevada certification. To schedule rides, call 702-455-0997 from one to three days in advance.

PEDESTRIAN POINTERS

THE WORD ON THE STREET.

To separate pedestrians from motorized traffic, overhead pedestrian bridges have been built over major intersections on Las Vegas Boulevard. Elevators and escalators assure easy overhead crossings at the Tropicana Avenue, Flamingo Road and Spring Mountain/Sands intersections.

The Fremont Street Experience was born by closing off Fremont Street (Downtown) and making it a domed pedestrian mall with the most fantastic light show you'll ever see. Accessible to all, it's not to be missed.
